PROCEEDINGS OF THE HEARING No. XI

A hearing of Admission Regulatory Committee (ARC) under the Chairmanship of Sh. S.N. Sahai, IAS (Retired) was held on 27th March, 2025 at 4:30 PM at Conference Hall, Room No. 216, Admin Block, Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women, Kashmere Gate, Delhi-110006 to deliberate upon grievances/representations/complaints received from aspiring candidates/parents/other stakeholders.

At the outset, the Secretary (TTE/HE)/Member Secretary (ARC) welcomed the Chairman and Members of the Committee. In the beginning, the Registrar (GGSIPU) gave the following updates to the Committee Members about the efforts made by GGSIPU for a smooth admission process:-

- Introduction of Admission Chatbot: An AI-based Chatbot service has been launched to provide instant answers to admission-related queries. This service is accessible on the university's website.
- **Application Deadlines**: The last date for online applications for all programs is March 31, 2025 (may be extended)

- Efforts are being made to complete the admission process before the deadline of July, 31, 2025.
- Received over 48,000 applications till date.
- The Registrar also shared admission statistics from the previous year:

Total Applications: 40,928Actual admissions: 33,355

- Vacant seats: 7,573 (19% of total intake)

The Committee has observed that vacant seats deprive deserving students of educational opportunities and also results in wastage of infrastructure and resources created by the institutes. To ensure optimum utilization of resources, the Committee recommended that efforts be made to ensure that No seat should remain vacant.

With the Chair's permission, pending complaints till March 25, 2025, were placed before the Committee. After deliberations, decisions were taken, and following directions issued:-

The Committee emphasized the importance of transparency and fairness in the admission process and further mandated GGSIPU to actively monitor and enforce these standards, leaving no room for discrepancies or violations. Regular audits and reports could be instituted to enhance oversight and accountability. Additionally, strict adherence to Rule 8 provisions regarding the publication of pre-counselling merit lists etc. was highlighted, with a directive that there should be no deviations from these established rules.
